

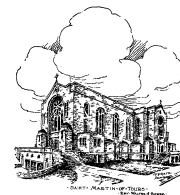

FROM THE PASTOR

Sursum Corda—Lift Up Your Hearts

Remember the Paperboy!!!

I was a Paperboy in the late 1950's. Thinking back on my first job, it was a great way for a young kid to sharpen his entrepreneurial skills and learn responsibility. I opened my first bank account with what I earned in my first few weeks pedaling the news of the day.

There were two of us delivery boys in our part of town. We were always good friends except when doing our jobs. Then we were fierce competitors seeing who could out run the other when a new prospective customer moved in.

Being a Paperboy was a "boys' world" back then. And that wasn't bad. The girls did their thing and we did ours, always respecting the invisible boundaries that defined a kids life during the cold war years. One always hoped that the cute girl with the bouncing pony tail (only girls wore pony tails in that era) would answer the door on collecting days. Chivalry had not yet completely disappeared. In the most innocent ways the girls would sneak a glance at the boys and the boys always checked their person to make sure they portrayed a proper knight in shining armor. My last delivery was the Anderson home and they had four daughters. And I am certain one liked the local red headed, freckle-faced Paperboy. Of course, as life would have it, we all went our separate and divinely determined ways.

Back to my paper route. I lived about six miles out of town and I rode the second bus being the very last stop. At about 4:15 I would shed my Catholic School uniform, change into my after school clothes, hop on my bike and head to the drop where my bundle of daily papers awaited me. We, paper carriers, learned the fine points of business from our Circulation Manager. Always count your inventory before starting out on your deliveries.

My route was exciting. It encompassed a densely populated area. From there I had to cross under the new highway. That's where I had to be vigilant as I entered another neighborhood risking the taunts and heckles of Huntsacker's Crowd. I had a remarkable knack of dealing with bullies. From there I went past farms, over a creek and canal to the trailer park. My parents always cautioned me about "those folks" in the trailer park. The worst problem I ever had in the park was showing up on Friday to collect and finding an empty space where once stood the mobile dwelling. I got stiffed a few times and learned some hard lessons about the business world. I'd finish up with the Mason's, whose son was a local tough guy with whom I went to school. He used to bust on me but because I gave it right back, there was a mutual respect. I ended up at the Anderson's where I always knocked on the door, handing in the paper and hoping the eldest daughter would answer the door.

I was a dutiful Paperboy. I never tossed the papers from my bike. I always slipped it between the doors, or under the mat or through the mail slot. You see, I quickly understood that quality delivery would reap a reward that came in the way of a tip on Friday afternoon. In the Eisenhower years a .10 cent tip was pretty good. A quarter was grand. Guess who regularly gave me .50 cents?

Being a Paperboy meant being out in the rain and snow, cold and wind. I'm sure there were days when I wished that I didn't have to go. In the winter I always arrived home from my route after dark.

But I learned the value of work and responsibility to my customers. Not to speak of the value of money!

In the end I wound up taking over the other carrier's route. His numbers were declining as mine were growing. I have always liked to think that it was because I was a good business boy (not a business man, because I wasn't there yet.).

My paper route became something of a dynasty. I passed it on to my brother, Mike who in turn, bequeathed our empire to my brother, Frank. I don't know what happened to it after that. All dynasties have a tendency of going the way of all flesh.

I have rather enjoyed this little exercise in nostalgia. And I'm thinking about what young boys are missing today. Besides all of the "little guy" business stuff, there developed people skills that are much needed in adult life and, sad to say, often neglected in our 21st century, high tech, impersonal society. Knocking on a door as a thirteen or fourteen year old in an effort to sell a product takes courage. Knowing how to do it with a convincing smile and a good sales pitch requires real chutzpah. Being steady and focused as a growing teenager called for perseverance. My parents, my parish priests and my teachers (many of whom were IHM's) all had a hand in some way influencing our little dynasty. And so did other neighbors who recognized in those kinder, gentler days that it really does "take a village". I'm glad I was a Paperboy.

La Alegría de la Buena Nueva + Las Lecturas y su mensaje

Isaías 66: 10-14c

La colección de poemas de los capítulos de Isaías recoge imágenes en las que se sugiere que reinaba cierta confusión en la vida religiosa del pueblo de Palestina de aquel tiempo. Se ofrece además la imagen de que los gentiles compartirán las riquezas de Israel después del juicio. Y una advertencia de que los siervos del Señor se separarán de los enemigos por medio de un juicio apocalíptico. La nueva Jerusalén que se anuncia es una ciudad de paz, en contraste con la Antigua Jerusalén donde reinaba la corrupción y la injusticia.

Gálatas 6: 14-18

Pablo ha tenido una fuerte polémica con los gálatas a costa del argumento contra la circuncisión de la comunidad de origen no judío. Pablo deplora la actitud de rivalidad de los gálatas, pero al final los llama hermanos, como signo de una cierta esperanza de lograr la reconciliación con ellos y su deseo de que se centren en la fidelidad al evangelio de Cristo más que las leyes que no dan vida ni espíritu.

Lucas 10: 1-22, 17-20

Solamente el evangelio de Lucas contiene dos episodios de envío a la misión. Al incluir setenta y dos, en lugar de los doce discípulos más cercanos de Jesús, parece referirse a la universalidad del mensaje. La tradición judía aseguraba que el mundo estaba dividido en setenta naciones. Por lo tanto, hay aquí una clara alusión a la universalidad tanto del mensaje como de la vocación al anuncio.
